the middle of the mixed emotions of Easter. For our family, however, the range of emotions were opposite that of Mary and her journey to the tomb. Mary approached the tomb with a heavy heart full of sadness, grief, probably some anger and fear, when she reached the tomb and it was empty she was filled with shock and disbelief. When she encountered Jesus she was filled with excitement and joy, and was sent to tell the others that Christ is risen.

But for us and the entire Strum

family, our Easter Sunday went like this. We joined with our faith communities and worshipped singing joyful hymns and proclaiming the hope and promise of the words "Christ is RISEN! Christ is RISEN indeed - ALLELUIA! " But lingering in the back of our minds was what we were going to do after worship. We were getting into our car and driving to lowa to have our own "last supper" Easter dinner with Aunt Connie. You see Aunt Connie was dying after a brave

battle with cancer. We were gathering together to celebrate the promise of Easter but also to say good-bye to a loved one. Aunt Connie was frail and sat in her chair dozing in and out but paying attention to her children, nieces and nephews, and grandchildren. As the day ended and we were preparing to leave. Aunt Connie gave each of her family members a gift. We each received eggs with a rock in them on the rocks were words – Peace - Love – Hope. Each person who received an egg got the word

that they needed most to hear.

My word was "hope".

We gathered to celebrate Aunt Connie's life a few short days after Easter. We processed into the sanctuary and as we walked in we saw the banner that read "Christ is RISEN! ALLELUIA!" It was then we were embraced by the hope, promise and love of Easter. It was in Christ's death and resurrection that were able to find peace - love - and hope. As we celebrate the Easter season remember that – in Christ we are new creation. In Christ, we

receive new life. People of God – shed the grave clothes of sin and death and live in the freedom of life that Christ has given you. Christ is RISEN! Christ is RISEN INDEED! **ALLELUIA!**

President Tom Dodge called the meeting to order.

The secretary's report was read and accepted.

Clayton presented the treasurer's report. There is \$12,221 in the checking account and \$71,495 in the savings account. There is \$34,200 in the heat fund.

BOARD REPORTS:

Stewardship: Duane delivered 11 bags of food to one of our church families. The family was very grateful.

Lay Ministry: Rosalie reported that plans for Maundy Thursday have been made.

Palms have been ordered and they are still taking orders for Easter flowers.

Church Properties: Brad is still in the process of replacing light bulbs.

Youth: They have served two Lenten suppers and are making plans for the Easter breakfast. If the girls' basketball team qualifies for the state tournament, there will be no supper on March 16.

Christian Education: Nothing new to report

Worship: Cathy asked that the Oh, Brother! Barbershop Group be reimbursed. Duane made the motion and Brad the second that we send the group \$100. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

• Clayton made the motion and Terresa the second that the Fisk family be allowed to use the fellowship hall for an open house for Donna as she celebrates her 90th birthday. Motion carried.

There was discussion on training for acolytes. Also discussed were requirements for Confirmation (Bible Camp, sermon notes, attendance at church, etc.) Ushering also was discussed. The council recommends that Pastor Krista share her wishes and perspective with the council.

Permission was granted to a representative from Habitat for Humanity to make a presentation at a church service.

The next meeting will be held in Madelia on April 13.

Pastor Morris Ulring, one of our former pastors from Trinity, died in Alexandria, MN on February 5th at the age of 95. He served Trinity 1977-1982

A brief obituary is listed below:

Rev. Morris E. Ulring was born on April 3, 1920 in Fairdale, ND. The oldest of four, he graduated from Hillcrest High School in Fergus Falls, MN and went first to Concordia college in Moorhead, MN and graduated from Augsburg college in Minneapolis, MN.

He received his seminary degree from Luther Seminary in St. Paul MN and served parishes in Frost, and Farwell MN, Oldham & Brandon SD, Estherville and Callender, IA, Truman MN and Cresco IA. In his retirement he served as a visitation pastor in Phoenix AZ and Columbus OH.

He was preceded in death by his first wife, Marion, his daughter Miriam (David) Larson, his parents, sister Ruth, and brothers, Joe and Don. Morris is survived by his wife, Grace, his sons David (Carol), Paul (June) and daughters Rhoda and Becky (Craig) Black, thirteen grandchildren and twelve great-grandchildren.

A Memorial Service will be held at 2 pm on Friday, June 17 at Hope Lutheran church, Walker MN. Interment will be next to Marion in the Solar Lutheran Church Cemetery, Webster, MN on June 18.

SHAVING CREAM EARTH

- A cookie sheet
