CENTRAL THINGS

Stir us up, O Lord.

Throughout Advent we prayed this prayer. Stir us up and make us active in our Advent journey. Now we enter Epiphany and look down the road

toward Lent. Ours is a continuous travel with God into the future. As we consider what God is up to in our community, we need to ask God to daily stir us up and enliven us to reach into people's lives and extend the call of Christ into our community.

Which brings me to New Year's Resolutions. Do you have any?

As we enter the New Year, it is a tradition for many to make New Year's resolutions of different kinds. We resolve to put an end to our bad habits – once and for all. Maybe you have not been good about exercising, for example and it is time for a new, active lifestyle. Or perhaps you have eaten a little too many things that you really shouldn't; that comes to an end as the clock passes midnight at the turn of the New Year. On January 1st, you are turning over a new leaf! "I will never again..." or, "From now on I will...." Those sentiments are well known. It is probably not the first time we have said that. Will we manage to keep our promises this time?

New Year's resolutions are great. We get stirred up to accomplish something we have perhaps planned on doing for a long time. So, seize the opportunity to overcome today – not because it is a new year, but because God called us to take up our cross *each* day!

Why did we not do it yesterday or last week? Perhaps we have waited almost a whole year – ever since last January, when we failed after only two weeks. It is one thing that the jogging trip was delayed four months because we couldn't handle the cold, or that the budget didn't work out as planned. But what about actual sins; those things that prevent God from doing His transforming work in us? Are we just as slow and procrastinating when it comes to that?

What is truly crucial is how well we have put things in order in our relationship to God! Have we taken a serious look at our thought-life and cleansed out all the sin and egotism we see in our lives? What does our conscience say – is there something hidden away? Something needs to happen now – in this moment!

It is just as important to continue, not give up, not become lazy. The consequences of slipping after a few weeks are much more serious when it concerns serving God. If you run in this race, it is not enough just to have a good or mostly good conscience. In contrast to a tired and out-of-shape jogger who is trying to get fit after Christmas, a disciple of Jesus has motivation and hope of completely different dimensions.

"But those who wait on the Lord

Shall renew their strength;

They shall mount up with wings like eagles, They shall run and not be weary, They shall walk and not faint." (Isaiah 40:31)

These people get their strength from God - astrength that is much stronger than muscles, far greater than human dreams and goals. With God's help, we will reach the goal we have set for ourselves: to partake of the life of Christ. Seize the opportunity for victory today – not because it is a new year but because God called us to take up our cross every day! (Luke 9:23)

TRINITY COUNCIL MINUTES



Trinity Council Minutes December 14, 2014

Present: Dave Sorenson, Laurie Wille, Clayton Duncanson, Jan Warrington, Janice Buhmann, Darrell Buhmann, Britta Hartman, Yvonne Noorlun, Vicar Kent Krumwiede, and Jan Ringeisen.

The minutes were read, and there was a correction. The Blue Earth radio station that will be used for cancellations is KJLY. The television station, KEYC will display the cancellation on their website.

Clayton gave the treasurer's report. The checking account balance is \$12,417 and the savings account balance is \$30,411.

It was decided to pay \$300 to support the Lutheran Memorial Home and \$20 for a gift for a new member. This will be added to December's bills.



Stewardship: Our Board pleages were down about pledges were \$8,500 from last

year's pledges. It was reported that last year's pledges were abnormally high.

Lay/Evangelism: Cards have been sent and a baptism was performed. The board has prepared to receive new members soon.

Education: The Sunday School Christmas program was performed on December 14, with a brunch following the service. Attendance was up this year. Youth: The youth group decorated and delivered cookies to 15 members.

Vicar Kent's Report: He has been making lots of visits. He

was pleased with the attendance at the Sunday School program. He has his new glasses and thanked the church for them. Kent just finished the fall semester of school and is preparing for the January term. He will graduate in 4 months and hopes to be ordained in 5 months. He wants to be ordained at Trinity.

OLD BUSINESS:

Yvonne said that Trinity does have a mission statement. It was written when we were doing our church profile.

The church has received the check from HyVee. Dave presented the check to Britta for the youth group, as was voted on earlier this year. The new total for HyVee receipts is \$29, 853.92. The total for Fareway receipts at this time is \$24,122.72. NEW BUSINESS:

Motion passed that Trinity start a Heating System fund. People may contribute to this fund if they wish. A Trinity family has privately donated \$12,500 to the fund for 2014 and will make another donation of \$12,500 in 2015. The old heating system has been checked and is up and running. The fund will later be used to purchase a new heating system.

Dave presented the list of new council members for 2015.

Green Lake Ministries sent a letter asking for a donation. Laurie mentioned that it might be nice to invite a Green Lake person to a church service to speak to the congregation. We could take up an offering to donate to Green Lake at that time. This was tabled until a later meeting. Shalom Hill Farms also sent a letter asking for a donation. This was also tabled until a later meeting. The 2014 board reports are due on January 2.

Trinity received a letter from the Southwest Minnesota Synod authorizing Vicar Kent to keep doing all of the things that he has been doing so far. He has 2 mentors assigned to him: Pastor Gene Alms from Sleepy Eye and Pastor Greg Hall from Madelia. The Call Committee has met. The chairman of the committee is Yvonne Noorlun and Tom Dodge will be the communications person. The committee is confident that the synod is in our corner. The call committee members are open to converse with anyone that has concerns. They will confidentially take the concerns to the call committee.

The council then worked on the 2015 budget. Britta moved to raise Brenda's church secretary salary \$.50/hour. This will increase her salary to \$14/hour. This pay increase will take effect in January. motion carried.



The shell's unique characteristics call to mind Christ's birth and death: the poinsettia- and lily-like images, holes representing the four nails and spear that pierced Jesus, small bones inside the shell resembling doves and thus symbolizing the Holy Spirit.
