A HISTORY OF QUILT MAKING AT TRINITY



Since there has not been much activity for WELCA because of COVID, I decided to write about our quilting. We have been making quilts for 50 years, starting in 1971. There have been 5,160 +

mission quilts made in that time which means an average of a hundred quilts each year.

In the beginning the quilts were made mostly from used clothing. We worked at church ripping, cutting pieces and doing most of the work at church. We remember Lavonne Huss at the ironing board. Several of us would bring our sewing machines. After Russell Nickerson retired he also brought his sewing machine and worked on the other side of the room! Some of us also brought our children if they were too young to be in school. Now the piecing is done at home so on quilting days the quilts are tied and hemmed around. We also have machines at church now though some bring their own machines.

Now our quilts are made mostly form new material which we are gifted with. Some is fabric that the owner no longer wants. We get a lot from people who no longer are able to or desire to sew. It does not all come from Trinity members, either. Another change is having the nice quilting room in which to keep our supplies. There were many years when we had to carry our supplies upstairs to the closet on the west side of the balcony.

I am not sure when we first started giving quilts to our graduates but I do know that the first years we would make some a little nicer and let the kids pick from those. Now we ask the seniors what their special interests are and also their favorite colors. Then we go shopping and buy the fabric.

Our noon meal has evolved, too. To begin with we had potlucks. Then we decided to give the café' some business. This year we brought bag lunches!

We would welcome you to join us in this project next year!




