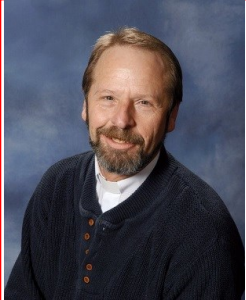

CENTRAL THINGS

Lent as a Time of Promise

Psalm 51 Litany

1 Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.

2 Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity,

and cleanse me from my sin. 3 For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. 4 Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are justified in your sentence and blameless when you pass judgment. 5 Indeed, I was born guilty, a sinner when my mother conceived me. 6 You desire truth in the inward being; therefore teach me wisdom in my secret heart. 7 Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. 8 Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones that you have crushed rejoice. 9 Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities. 10 Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me.

11 Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. 12 Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit. 13 Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you. 14 Deliver me from bloodshed, O God, O God of my salvation, and my tongue will sing aloud of your deliverance. 15 O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise. 16 For you have no delight in sacrifice; if I were to give a burnt offering, you would not be pleased. 17 The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

This psalm is very well-known to us, particularly verses 10-12 which is the body of our weekly Offering Hymn (ELW 181). The psalm itself begins the Lenten season on Ash Wednesday. Too often we read this psalm in a sorrowful fashion [not that there is no sorrow here, after all it was written by King David following Nathan's confronting him with his infidelity with Bathsheba and his murder of Uriah, Bathsheba's husband (c.f. 2 Samuel 11:1-12:13)], We know we should be in mourning like David as we

read this. But let's take another look at this through the lens of joy. Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions" (v. 1). The psalmist writes this knowing that God will and does just as he asks. God is merciful on account of his steadfast love for his creation. When we cry out in faith, God is faithful and just and will forgive us our transgressions (1 John 1:9). How about verse 17: "The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise."

Because we know that God is faithful and just, true to his word, we also know that God will not and does not despise us. Paul reminds us:

"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith-- and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God -- not by works, so that no one can boast. For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works" (Ephesians 2:8-10a).

So, as God's handiwork we are the image of God, though broken we may be. Still, we are God's people and heirs of the promise upon which God has staked his name and through which the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ God has guaranteed his promise. Paul writes to Timothy, the second letter, even...

"if we are faithless, he [God] remains faithful -- for he [God] cannot deny himself." (2Ti 2:13).

So, this Lenten season, keep this handy and daily refer to Psalm 51. Read the regular print aloud and the bold print silently in your secret heart where God has promised to implant his wisdom for living.

Lent is not necessarily about doom and gloom. It is about who we are, and who God is. Even David experience God's grace in the midst of his mournful confession -- "Then David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD." Nathan replied, "The LORD has taken away your sin" (2 Samuel 12:13). God indeed "washes [us] thoroughly from [our] iniquity, and cleanses [us] from [our] sin" (Psalm 51: 2).

Blessed Lenten Season.

Stewardship: The food collected by the congregation has been delivered to the food shelf.

Lay Ministry: There will be a baptism on Feb. 15th. They will have forms to order flowers for Easter. The Senior Reception has been moved to May 31st and the last day of Sunday school will be on May 10th. **Maundy Thursday service is set for 10:00 am with Coffee & rolls to follow. All are invited to attend, not just senior citizens!** And a sign up sheet will be available so they know how many to plan for.

Church Properties: They are looking into having reserved spots for Senior citizens on the south side of the church so they have an easier access to the church. Motion carried to take \$100 to purchase signs out of the building fund. They are also checking on the air compressor as it is making loud noises.

Christian Education: The committee has been meeting once a week to get more kids to participate in Sunday School. The 1st & 2nd Sundays they will have regu-

lar Sunday school. Then the 3rd Sunday will be Bring a Family member to help with a project and the 4th Sunday will be Community Sunday where all members are invited to attend and help the students with a community project. The first one will be to make fleece blankets for the residents at Truman Senior Living center.

Youth: They have been planning the Lenten Suppers and also the breakfast for after the Easter morning service. After Easter they will be making plans for an outing and fun activities.

Worship: Still need more ushers and greeters. It was decided that **Easter Breakfast will be at 7:30 am with the church service at 9:00.** The firemen have removed all the folding chairs that were donated to them. This leaves room for the storage rack that Pam & Dennis Rode donated to put the Christmas tree branches on.

OLD BUSINESS: The pictorial directories have still not come in but Laurie was told they should be here by February 17th. There was some discussion on the front doors that must be unlocked and locked either with a key or the Allen wrench. The south door is still accessible with the key pad.

NEW BUSINESS: Teresa made a motion and Tom seconded to approve the use of the church facilities to 4 different requests from members and the motion carried.

American Church Group has made a request to give Trinity an insurance rate and Peterson, Anthony has also requested a chance to quote. Brad will check with Profinium where we now have insurance and also with past board members on the past reviews of our insurance policies.

Vicar Kent reported that he has been making as many visitations as possible between weather and health when able. He has made up a Lenten schedule and order of worship. His goal is to have members reach out to the community and invite people they know to church at Trinity. May 3rd will be the Blessing of the Seeds worship there will be a guest speaker that Sunday as Vicar Kent will be unavailable. He is looking forward to his upcoming graduation at Luther Seminary with graduation events from Thursday, May 14th thru Sunday May 17th. We will look into pulpit supply from the Luther Seminary for that time. He will also be taking a long overdue vacation on June 8th – 11th.

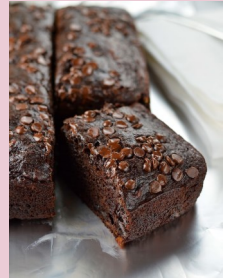


DOUBLE CHOCOLATE BANANA CAKE

Made healthier with no oil or butter.

Ingredients

- 3 medium ripe bananas
- ¾ cup brown sugar
- ½ cup applesauce
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1 egg, lightly beaten.
- 1 cup flour
- ½ cup cocoa powder
- 1 tsp baking soda
- ¼ tsp salt



- 1 cup semi sweet chocolate chips
- mini chocolate chips for topping - optional

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees and coat an 8 inch square pan with cooking spray.

Combine the mashed bananas and sugar into a large mixing bowl and stir until the sugar is dissolved.

Add the applesauce, vanilla and egg. Stir to combine.

Stir in the flour, cocoa powder, baking soda and salt. Add the chocolate chips and pour into the prepared baking pan.

Sprinkle mini chocolate chips over the top and bake for 25-30 minutes.

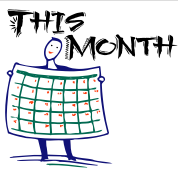

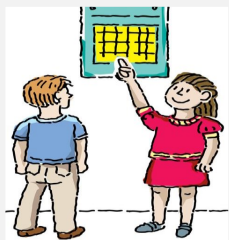

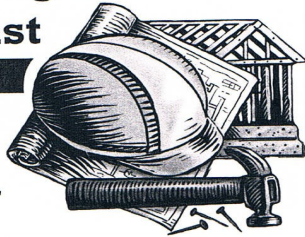

Trinity Call Committee Update



CALL COMMITTEE

The Trinity call committee is consulting with synod officials to explore options for hiring a pastor, pending the departure of Vicar Kent later this year. We are exploring options to hire a part-time pastor, which when considering salary, health benefits and housing allowance, is the scenario best fit for Trinity's budget.

Various scenarios include sharing a pastor with a neighboring church within our synod district. Or, perhaps we split pastoral duties among individuals for Sunday service (marriages and funerals), visitations and youth programming. It has been suggested, for instance, that a recently retired pastor somewhere in the district might be hired to either do visitations or attend to Sunday duties.

The synod is aware of our needs. The committee understands that it is likely not financially feasible to entertain the notion of a full-time pastor. We are only at the tip of the iceberg in what may be a long process. However, by the grace of God, a realistic, workable solution also could as easily avail itself to us. Our goal is to establish a position that gives our congregation stability and the opportunity to grow.

The committee appreciates the feedback we have received from congregation members and we welcome any input you may have. Committee members are: Yvonne Noorlun (chair), Marlene Breitbarth, Tom Dodge, Grant Hartman, Barb Mager, Sadie Mosloski, Dave Sorenson.

Rooster

The rooster is reminiscent of Peter's threefold denial of Jesus on the night of Jesus' trial (Matthew 26:34, NIV); thus, it may represent faithlessness in general, especially in the face of danger. Because of the rooster's early-morning call, it's also symbolic of watchfulness: "Therefore keep watch," said Jesus, illustrating the return of the Son of Man, "because you do not know when the owner of the house will come back — whether in the evening, or at midnight, or when the rooster crows, or at dawn" (Mark 13:35, NIV).
